The Brilliant Club

I am really pleased to let you know we have launched The Brilliant Club at Stalham High School. The programme, which is designed to support students into post-18 education, involves fourteen Year 9 students working with a PhD tutor on a university style project, alongside other activities. Most recently, this was a visit to Cambridge University.

Specialist Resource Base (SRB)

Work has begun on our Specialist Resource Base which will open in September 2023. The additional provision is being funded by Norfolk County Council to create an additional 20 school places for children with Autistic Spectrum Conditions. With the specialist staff we are recruiting, our SRB students will receive additional support, enabling them to access mainstream school as much as possible, alongside specialist support.
